HEBREW BIBLE READING

Exodus 34:29-35

The Old Testament reading tells the story of Moses on Sinai. It was on Mount Sinai that Moses received the Ten Commandments from God. When he descends his face is shining with brightness so unnatural that it unnerves the Israelites, so Moses covers his face with a veil. The message we learn from this is that the Israelites were unprepared or unwilling to encounter God's glory. Are you?
